



Job Description: Lead TA Level 4 and Hub Lead TA

Job title: Teaching Assistant

Main duties and responsibilities

1. To complement the work of teachers by taking responsibility for agreed learning activities both in and out of school, under an agreed system of supervision that supports the teacher with learning outcomes.
2. To provide high quality support in relation to the raising of educational achievement and to encourage pupils to become independent learners.
3. To coordinate with the class teacher and SENDCo to organise, facilitate and support pupils when in the SEND Learning Hub.

Specifically

1. To deliver learning activities that enable the development of pupils, adjusting activities according to pupil's responses/needs.
2. To support and deliver agreed learning activities whole classes/groups in the absence of the teacher.
3. To provide targeted high-level support for any pupils identified by the SLT, whether individually or in groups, using activities planned by the teacher.
4. To effectively use IT to support learning activities and develop pupil's competence and independence in its use.
5. To monitor and assess pupils, recording and reporting on pupil achievement, progress and developing against pre-determined learning objectives.
6. To discuss and review the required support and delivery of learning provided on a regular basis with the teacher.
7. To work within the schools' agreed procedures, specifically in relation to teaching and learning, inclusion and behaviour and discipline policies.

8. To provide objective and accurate feedback and reports as required on pupil achievement, progress and other matters, using agreed procedures.
9. To support the emotional well-being of pupils to ensure they are happy and are able to learn.
10. To support the development of and implement provision maps and/or Personalised Learning Plans and to promote the inclusion of all pupils within the classroom and hub.
11. Promote independence using strategies to recognise and reward achievement of self-reliance.
12. To establish productive relationship with pupils and the setting of high expectations and to organise and manage appropriate learning environment and resources.
13. To effectively contribute to multi agency working to support pupil's development and liaise with parents/carers regarding pupil achievement and other associated matters.
14. Direct the work, where relevant, of other adults in supporting learning within the Learning Hub.
15. To carry out any other duty as directed by the line manager and commensurate with the responsibility level of the post.
16. To carry out all duties of the post, in line with the school's equal opportunities policy.
17. To work within the school's health and safety policies/procedures.
18. Knowledge / Skills: A high standard of literacy and numeracy skills
